Subject: Policy guidelines on requests from various Universities and Institutions regarding admission through Central Counselling Board constituted by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India- regarding.

Sir,


I am directed to state that the matter relating to requests received from various Universities and Institutions regarding their inclusion in Central Counselling Boards has been examined in this Ministry and it has been decided that the following guidelines will be strictly followed by the Central Counselling Board constituted by this Ministry:

- (i) The scheme of offering admissions through CCB (on the basis of result of AIEEE) counselling process should be made available only to Centrally-funded Government Institutions.
- (ii) For the SFIs i.e. Self-financed Institutions, their entry will be restricted to 'Spot Round' only with the following conditions:
  - (a) All courses offered for admission through CCB should have valid AICTE/UGC approval for the current year. In case of multiple campuses, separate approval should be available for all such campuses. Such SFIs should not offer any of the Engineering/Technology programmes through distance mode.
  - (b) All 100% of the approved intake would be offered admission through CCB counselling (except for NRI seats). Management quota, if any, would also be offered only from the merit list of AIEEE.
  - (c) Minimum academic qualifications (academic eligibility) requirement for AIEEE-2011 would be strictly as announced by the CBSE in the AIEEE-2011 information brochure.
  - (d) The SFIs would abide by all the guidelines and deadlines issued by CCB-2011 from time to time for the smooth conduct of online counselling process.
  - (e) The fees for participation in the CCB-2011 counselling process would remain same as in the last year i.e. Rs.10 lakh per SFI.

2. It has been resolved to communicate the above policy decision to the Chairman (CCB-2011) with further instructions to directly deal with all such requests for participation in Central Counselling process as per the guidelines provided above.

3. This issues with the approval of the Hon'ble HRM.
